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The Whole School, Whole Community, Whole Child (WSCC) model expands on the eight elements of CDC's coordinated school health framework. CDC and the Association for Supervision and Curriculum Development (ASCD) developed this expanded model—working with key leaders from the fields of health, public health, education, and school health—to strengthen learning and health in our nation's schools.

Ten components of WSCC

- Health Education
- PE & Physical Activity
- Nutrition Environment & Services
- Health Services
- Counseling, Psychological, & Social Services
- Social & Emotional Climate
- Physical Environment
- Employee Wellness
- Family Engagement
- Community Involvement

Virtual Healthy School

CDC's <u>Virtual Healthy School</u> is an online, interactive school building that allows users to see how the 10 components of the Whole School, Whole Community, Whole Child (WSCC) model are integrated into the following places:

- Classroom
- Cafeteria
- Gymnasium
- Principal's office
- Counselor's office
- Nurses office
- Playground
- Surrounding community
- Home

The Virtual Healthy School gives life to the WSCC model through the familiar environment of a school, showing education professionals that schools just like theirs can easily be transformed to meet the needs of the whole child so that every student is ready to learn.

This tool can be used by anyone looking to make their local school a healthier place for students and staff.

"Principal Paul" welcomes users to Jefferson School and invites them to explore. The home screen has 10 colored doors that open to different areas within the school.


